





Delegates were elected to attend the state convention, were Bart Kelson and Roger Higgs with Roger Best and Rolland Ekena as alternates.

#### Brimfield, Ill., Moves Into Its New Community House

By D. H. Johnson, Secretary The Brimfield Commercial Club, Brimfield, Ill.

Brimfield, Ill., a town of only 600 people has constructed a community house at a cost of \$30,000.

The Brimfield Community Building is the result of the awakened community feeling that our boys and girls are entitled to the best that can be provided in the way of legitimate and wholesome amusement and entertainment. A stock company was formed and incorporated for \$20,000.00, no stock holder being privileged to hold more than ten shares. This assured a wide distribution of the stock and a very general feeling of personal ownership and interest in the building. The stockholders at present number about two hundred men and women, holding from one to ten shares each.







#### WAR MEMORIAL FEATURE.



Fm. 20.-Community house at Brimdeld, Ill.

Dedicated in 1919 in a village of 700 population as a memorial to the soldier. who served in the World War. A well-planned building, serving a town and country community of 2,000 people. Building unfornished cost \$26,654, and the plant was financed by the issuance of 600 shares of stock to 265 holders, one-halt being farmers, and a loan of \$10,000. A motion-picture machine, part of the equipment, helps maintain the building. Seating capacity of auditorium and balcony is 1,200. Building has a fireplace, two heating plants, electric and ventilating fans, oir pressure tank, and electric lights,
